


P4 Life Skills - Sewing

The P4 Life Skills event on the 16 May 2018 was well organised by Central Parent Council and run by parent volunteers. It was a great opportunity for me to bond with my daughter, Charlize, and her class mates in 4 Daisy.

There were about 40 Parent volunteers who participated in this year's P4 Life Skills activities. Our children were taught to thread a needle, sew a basic running stitch and sew a button. Everyone was given a sewing kit which consists of a needle, thread, a button and a red stripe cloth. While the form teachers played a video for the girls to follow, the parents guided the children in groups of 4 to 6.



What seemed easy became challenging or a nightmare to some as the thread got tangled up and the girls had a tough time unknotting and disentangling the thread. You can observe the different personalities at work. It is fun working with the girls and watching them either patiently or impatiently trying to catch up with the rest of the class as they tried to produce their finest needlework. It kept the Parent Volunteers on their toes throughout the 50 min session.



Thanks to the teamwork among the parent volunteers, the event ended without a hitch and the girls went home satisfied with their masterpiece. Everyone had a great time and that's all that matters!
